Sub : Transfers & Postings in the grade of Superintendents consequent on CR 2014-Regarding.
Ref : Assn. Letters 16/14 DT 25/09/14,22/14 DT 09/10/14,23/14 DT 17/10/14 on the subject.

I invite your kind attention to the subject and reference as also the discussions the office bearers of this Association had with your good self on 09/10/14 & 12/10/14. During such discussions the Association office bearers had made a specific request to adhere to the transfer policy guidelines issued by Chennai CCA and dated 13/02/2008. Those requests include

[i] To bring back officers sent out on promotion to places outside Chennai as there were a number of posts newly created . It was also that post June 2013 officers on promotion continued to be retained in Chennai while those who were sent out were forced to stay outside Chennai stipulating non completion of tenure in terms of Guidelines dated 13/02/2008. The assurance to bring them back translated to perversity as four officers were posted to Audit II Commissionerate and asked to stay put in Puducherry.

[ii] It was also requested that till AGT 2015 and till a new policy is evolved post,creation of new formations the exercise be restricted to minimum in respect of other officers and that only the newly promoted be adjusted in new formations along with the shortages being filled on willingness basis.

[iii] That representations from officers be considered on merit/compassion.

It is with deep regret that I wish to record that none of the above suggestions were considered and instead an Order No.113/2014 dated 03/11/14[Actually released on 05/11/2014] was issued with very little time for representations[Relief date being specified as 10/11/14]. It has also been brought to our notice that the outstation tenure in respect of Large Taxpayer Units[where a 3 year relief from AGT on long standing basis has been given to those who serve in LTU's] is planned to be extended to some other areas considered to be elitist formations. Different norms are being adopted for different formations and are being done without a proper transfer policy having been framed in consultation with the Association[In terms of Chairman,CBEC letter dt 04/07/1997].

The staff are feeling completely demoralized by non consideration of the above and the lack of action on infrastructure front. The association requests that the grievances be resolved immediately after hearing us out.
